

First Meeting

Speedway is unpredictable and you can't plan anything really and this exactly the case with my first meeting. I got a phone call from Barry Bishop (Promoter of Isle of Wight Speedway) on Wednesday evening to ride in the Vince Mapley Memorial the next day and this was a great opportunity for me to get some racing before my under 21 semi-final at Somerset. The meeting could not have gone any better with me scoring 17 points out of a possible 18 and taking the win in the final – not bad for someone who wasn't even in the meeting 24 hours previous.

Under 21 Semi-Final

In order to reach the final of the British Under 21 Championship I had to place in the top 3 in the semi-final at Somerset on Good Friday. It was a 12 rider field with the top 8 to 2 semi-finals with the top 3 from the final reaching the grand final at Berwick. I honestly really struggled throughout the heats but just kept plodding away and made it into the semi-final. Then into the final. All I had to do was not come last...and I didn't. I managed to get a really good start getting out into the lead in front of the local favourite Henry Atkins, who managed to pass me but then unfornately suffered mechanical gremlins allowing me to retake the lead and also the meeting VIC-TORY! This meant I was now through to the grand final at Berwick on April 27th.
